

Great progress has been made, but we still have work to do. **Blueprint for Change: Next Steps in the Journey** identifies critical areas that must be addressed:

- Starting your journey with the 'First Conversation'
- Building a workforce for I/DD services and supports
- Establishing 'Shared Living' for residential supports
- Developing a statewide system for challenging behaviors and mental health
- Navigating managed care

### **Erskine Green Training Institute**

The Arc not only advocates for change, we are working to be part of that change by establishing the Erskine Green Training Institute in Muncie, Indiana. This postsecondary education program provides vocational training for employment at hotels, restaurants, and hospitals.
