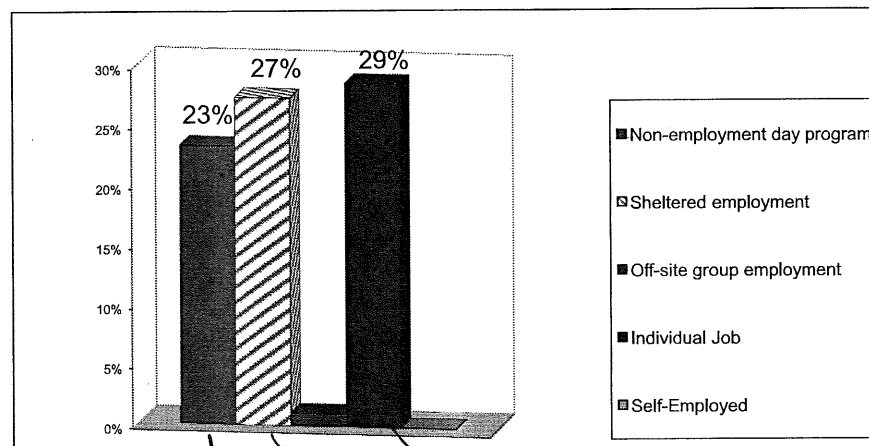
A Little History

- Questions were designed with providers through statewide input
- 2002 - piloted the first web-based data collection system
- Designed to:
 - ✓ link to 317 plan
 - ✓ provide individual service recipient (vs program) data
 - ✓ Allow individual programs access to their data
 - ✓ Use for policy decisions and DD Commission

Highlights of 2017

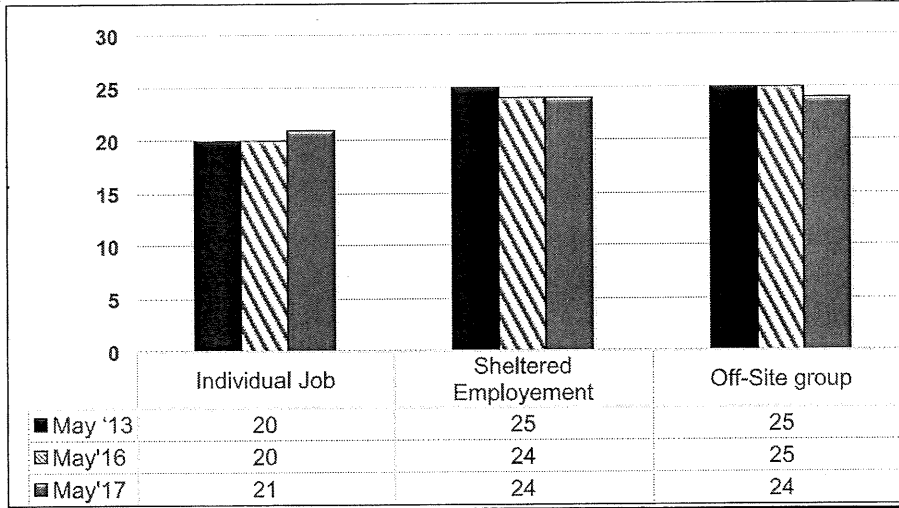
- 13,317 Hoosiers with disabilities day and employment status reported by 63 programs (65%)
 - 3,643 (27%) were served through sheltered facility employment,
 - 143 (1%) through off-site group employment,
 - 3,830 (29%) through individual competitive jobs,
 - 9 (.06%) through self-employment,
 - 3,097 (23%) were reported as being involved in non-employment day programming, and
 - 2,595 (19%) through alternatives to employment (ATE).

Primary Environment

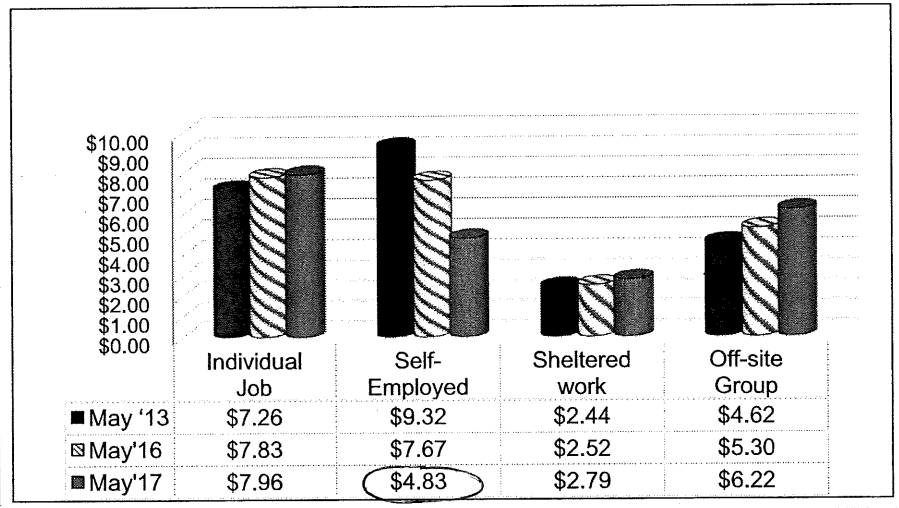


non-employment sheltered indiv. jobs
